## Message from the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

It gives me great pleasure to share with you highlights and achievements at the end of the year gone by and our future plans. It is also time to ponder about the goals set up in the beginning of the year and how close we succeeded in achieving them.



Before proceeding further I would like to acknowledge active involvement and engagement of our team members in a wide range of initiatives. Their passion and enthusiasm, fuelled by commitment to bring qualitative change in the lives of people we are working with is truely inspirational and commendable. The responsiveness of our members to our mission and objective has been quite overwhelming.

The NGO continued with all its activities as in the past and added few more programmes. Micro finance, micro insurance, financial literacy trainings, health and sanitation, HIV awareness, SHG formation and their bank linkage, solar lamps distribution and consumer awareness programmes etc continued as before. We got attention of NABARD and District cooperative Bank, Dehradun to impart education about digital mode of financial transactions to people in Dehradun district to cope with currency shortage during Demonetization period.

Last year we entered into the field of rural home stays by adopting Raithal village in Uttarkashi district. The concept of rural home stays is about exposing tourists to the unique culture of hilly folks and offer them an opportunity to be with nature away from rush and noise of city life. Over a dozen families have spared a room or two in their house, renovate and made it presentable for tourists to stay with the host families. Efforts are on to get these houses registered with the tourism department, get support from Uttarakhand government to help these people do some additional construction and bring the house on tourism radar of the state and the country. As the end of the year about 6 families have started receiving guests and getting steady income from home stays.

The NGO was chosen to spread education about ill effects of tobacco use on tender minds of students. Health Department, Government of Uttar Pradesh entrusted us conducting awareness workshops in 70 schools/ colleges each in Saharanpur and Bijnor districts. We also conducted feasibility survey in interior of Chamoli and Tehri districts for installation of solar system in far away villages.

We believe that the Annual Report of an NGO plays a crucial role in communicating its progress and status to stakeholders, community members, donors and well-wishers. Keeping that in veiw we brought some of the highlights of the year 2016-17. No year is without its challenges and last year too certainly had its share. Life is never a smooth journey as the road ahead is full of bumps and potholes. But we firmly believe that challenges bring opportunities. Friends, I wish I could talk on the management, governance, finance and future plans in my address but it would be more appropriate to deal them separately in the report.

#### Mission, Vision and Objectives of Balajee Sewa Sansthan

#### **HIV-AIDS (Target Intervention) Program**

NGO was chosen by Uttarakhand State Aids
Control Society to work with the migrant population
in Dehradun district under Targeted Intervention
Programme. Targeted Interventions (TI) are a specific
set of intervention in HIV/AIDS Control Programmes
meant specifically to reach out to groups seen to
practice high-risk behavior (HRG). The High Risk
Behavior Groups mainly comprise of Female Sex



Workers (FSW), Injecting Drug Users (IDUs), Men having Sex with Men (MSM) and Bridge Groups (Migrant workers, Truckers and Local Transport Workers).

Apart from prevention of HIV infection, TIs facilitate prevention and treatment of sexually transmitted diseases as they increase the risk of HIV infection, and are linked to care, support and treatment services for HIV infected.

The TI is implemented through the NGOs. We have been entrusted with working with the migrant population in Dehradun and we have focused upon migrant people in Dehradun and Selaqie. In year ended on 31st march we have covered 13500 People under the programme, which included interaction with the migrants, knowing their sexual behavior through persuation , involving the community leaders, Behaviour Change Communication, Treatment of Sexually Transmitted Infections, Condom Promotion, Enabling environment & Community Mobilization.

Emphasis has been to identify the HRG, counsel them for testing, treatment of sexually transmitted diseases and if found infected with HIV take them to the ICTC for treatment and counsel them not to spread the disease and live with the virus. Counseling helps people to understand that they may lead a normal life provided they take ART and keep positive attitude.

It is the policy of BSS, to always be in emotional and social touch with our beneficiaries. Our team celebrates local & national festivals, as and when the occasion arises, amongst the migrant workers every year. Contributing and sharing their joy. Our team celebrated International AIDS day every year on 1<sup>st</sup> Dec as well as Chhat Puja with migrants labourer of Bihar, Holi Milansamaroh, Cricket match etc.

# School Program under NTCP For Effective Implementation of COTPA 2003

**School Programmes- Weaning away young minds from tobacco use:** For last 4 years the NGO has been quite active in spreading message about tobacco abuse prevalent among peole of hill state and also the young boys and girls. Combined and sustained efforts of the Health department and the NGO, entire Tehri district was declared smoke free s from 26th Janauary 2014.

Recognising our efforts in implementation of tobacco control legislation, Health department, Government of Uttar Pradesh chose us to conduct school programmes in Bijnor and Saharanpur district. Under the programme 70 Government/ Publict schools have been selected to tell students about harmful effects of smoking and tobacco use on their health as well health of those coming into contact with the smoke.

Main idea of conducting workshop was to make young minds aware of the harmful and addictive effects of tobacco products on their users and spread a message against starting smoking and tobacco use and in case of users to wean them away from the habit lest it takes dangerous turn.

We described subject in a way easy to understand by all. The documentaries were quite effective in conveying the message of harmful effects. We also touched upon the concept of second hand and third hand smoke which is equally harmful, if not more, on the health of people subjected to such type of smoke. Rules relating to Anti Tobacco legislations were discussed in brief to make people aware of banning of smoke in public areas, near educational institutes and sale of tobacco products by or to the minors.

The students took a pledge not to take to smoking, quit the habit in case of smokers and not let other people to vitiate the environment by smoking in public places.

We had requested the Teacher coordinator to form a squad of 4-5 boy/girls to educate people about provisions of COTPA-2003. There should be no sale of tobacco products within 100 yards radius of the Institute and there should be posters displayed at prominent places in the institute saying that the premise is a no smoking area.

#### **Events organized on World No Tobacco day- May 2016**

To make people aware of harmful effects of tobacco on the health of their users and also people who involuntarily come into contact of tobacco products World No Tobacco day is observed on 31<sup>st</sup> May every year. An initiative of the WHO it is widely publicized by the Government and Non Government voluntary agencies. On the occasion Balajee organized following events in Dehradun:

Seminar at Tanisque factory at Kuawala, Dehradun: -A programme on smoking and tobacco abuse for workers, security staff and Management of the workshop was organised at their premises. urn. About 60 employees working in different establishments took part in the workshop. Not only they listened to the specialists describing effects of tobacco on human health they participated too by airing their views on the subject. Documentaries on smoking and their injurious effect on the health of users as well as passerby were screened.

#### **Tuberculosis Prevention and Control Program**

The Union South East Asia, New Delhi identified the NGO to work with the pockets having more population density in Doiwala and Raipur block. Teams of the NGO visit all household of the identified area, conduct meeting to tell them aabout the disease, its symptoms, make their own judgement, sollect sputum of the persons having cough/ fever consistently for 2-3 weeks, get the samples tested and start medication with the help of Aasha/Anganwadi workers.

The team have till far collected 350 samples of sputum and got these tested at government designated laboratories. Till far 23 patients are identified to be infected with the diseae and theier treatment have started all patients are found to be suffering from drug resistant variant of the bacteria and they are being counseled and treated as per TB eradication programme



Tuberculosis (TB) is considered one of India's severest health crises. Despite an extensive national program and a vast private sector, India continues to bear the highest burden of TB in the world, accounting for an estimated 2.2 million cases every year and killing more than 300,000 persons. Additionally, a growing burden of drug resistant TB (DR-TB) threatens all the progress made in basic TB control. India's TB problem is

increasingly considered a global problem. India's Revised National TB Control Program (RNTCP) was once considered a global leader in basic TB control. Balajee were chosen by the UNION- International Union against Tuberculossis and Lung Disease, South East Asia as an Implementing NGO to cover Rishikesh TU (Doiwala, Raipur, Rishikesh) of Dehradun

District in the Uttarakhand under project Axshya. Activities include planning meetings/events in the areas/villages in consultation with DC and RNTCP staff, Conduct community meetings every month including Gaon Kalyan Samities meeting with stake holders of the village/community heads and follow up of the said meetings to enhance the case detection rate and reduce the treatment interrupters, Conduct mid media activity in the areas mentioned



in the planning sheet submitted to DTO. Sensitize community in the designated areas through Axshya Samvad and ensure that symptomatic are identified and brought to the nearest health facilities for diagnosis and treatment. Collect and transport sputum samples (two) of each symptomatic and collect report from the DMC and inform symptomatic about the result. i.e. in both the cases either positive or negative. Retrieve treatmen interrupter/initial defaulter/defaulter and initiate their treatment with RNTCP and train volunteer on the above mentioned activity with the support of District coordinator and ensure that meetings/events should be conducted through trained volunteers.

AS at the end of finacial year 80 community meetings held at SHG and Gram Panchayat level, 18 Mid media campaign conducted,6 Volunteers trained, 180 samples of sputum collected, 7640 family cover under axshay sambad meetings and awareness meetings in Doiwala and Raiwala block of Dehradun district and 8 people were found infected with the disease. Balajee Sewa Sansthan provide nutrition support to the TB Patients and tie up with Dots provider to ensuring timely—proper diet and medicine.

Water & Sanitation Program: Construction of Low cost Toilets

for the Poor Family



Despite efforts of government and non government agencies, people in most of Indian villages still go to fields to defecate. The total sanitation campaign has changed toilets habits of villagers too. While the medium class has a toilet in their houses the poor are still deprived of this basic necessity. Balajee Sewa Sansthan constructs low cost toilets in Patna & other districts of Bihar. The poorest of the poor are selected for constructing toilets in their houses. Poor having no disposable funds can contribute to the

toilet construction through labor. Balajee has wide experience of construction of low cost toilets and so far constructed more than 2000 such toilets in 32 villages in 3 district of Bihar Constructed in last 8 years. We have received donations from Give india Platform

**Total Sanitation Campaign** is a comprehensive programme to ensure sanitation facilities in rural areas with a broader goal to eradicate the practice of open defecation. Balajee Sewa sansthan has been a part of TSC regarding Information, Education and mmunication (IEC), Capacity Building and Hygiene Education for effective behavior change of the targeted group. The NGO has constructed the low cost toilets with support from the financial Support of Giveindia Foundation and Individual donation. We are not taking any types of contribution from the beneficiary in construction of the toilets.



#### **HEALTH & SANITATION AWARENESS PROGRAMME:-**

Our Society organized workshops in villages to make the people aware of the health hazards involved in open defecation and the importance of making toilets in the home. They were also educated in personal health and hygiene and diseases, related to unsafe water consumption. Women participants were told to keep their surroundings clean and avoid contaminating sources of water with filth and garbage. In short, preventive health education, stressing on the importance of personal and environmental cleanliness.

The NGO has been entrusted with construction of low cost toilets in 3 district in Bihar for last several years and till far constructed over 2000 such toilets under total sanitation campaign. The programme has been running under watchful eye of Public Health Engineering Department of Bihar. Total Sanitation Campaign is a comprehensive programme to ensure sanitation facilities in rural areas with broader goal to eradicate the practice of open defecation. It follows a principle of "low to no subsidy" where a nominal subsidy in the form of incentive is given to rural poor households for construction of toilets. NGO has been a part of TSC on Information, Education and Communication (IEC), Capacity Building and Hygiene Education for effective behaviour change of the targeted group.

#### FINANCIAL SERVICES- Micro Finance under brand name "Sarthak Microfinance"



Typical microfinance clients are poor and low-income people that do not have access to other formal financial institutions. Microfinance clients are usually self-employed, household-based entrepreneurs. Their diverse "microenterprises" include small retail shops, street vending,

artisanal manufacture, and service provision.

Microfinance involves number of steps right from survey of the localities, meeting with potential clients, need assessment survey, Group formation and compulsory training of the clients, loan disbursements and regular weekly meetings for loan recovery and follow up.

Micro lending is done in a group of five clients which is known as Joint Liability Group (JLG). Loans are disbursed to the individual clients and members of the JLG stand as a surety for repayment by the members of that group. MFIs disburse Micro loans in cash and recover that in cash in weekly meetings. Personal touch with the clients through out the loan cycle and each member of the group guaranteeing repayment of other members in that particular group ensures full recovery of the loan amount. Our recovery rate is 100% and it shall be our endeavor to keep it at this level.

#### Self Help Groups & JLGs Promotional Activity



Self HelpGroups formation and bank linkage Activity: Balajee Sewa Sansthan has formed 525 SHGs up to last three year by the financial support of NABARD, Dehradun Region. BSS all ready formed and linked with Bank of 50 SHGs of BPL family for DRDA Dehradun in Sahaspur Block. In last Year more than 75 lakh saving created by SHG members and utilizing for inter loaning among the member as per her needs and requirements.

More than 240 Self Help Groups credit linked with bank and disburse more than 130 lakh loan among them for their income generation activities.

Balajee organizing group leader training as well as financial literacy training to the SHGs members. The concept of DBT has made it compulsory for all eligible people to give account with banks. The relative advantage of Uttarakhand Gramin bank and other nationalized bank of insurance of Rs. One lac in case of accidental death for all savings accounts holders was

explained. The team explained them the power of savings avoiding wasteful expenditure and build capital for a better future. Importance of Thoughtfulborrowing, securing future by life and minsurance and investing the hard earned money wisely. All they require is analyzing their needs, make a distinction between the need and desire, avoid wasteful expenditure and save for the future. A saving whatever small is a source of tremendous self confidence and helps in creation of wealth over a period of

time. People who could not afford any initial



amount to open account with Banks were advised to open NO Frill Savings bank accounts with Bank.

Farmer Producer Organization, JLG and Kisan club Promotional & Bank Linkage Activity: Balajee Sewa Sansthan is promoting 20 Kisan club and one FPO in Dehradun district where more then 20 village nad 400 farmers cover under this program. In last Four years BSS team also formed 100 JLgs and Credit linkage of 70 Joint Liabilities Groups by the financial support of NABARD. In last 4 Year more than 175 lakh loan disbursed by the different bank of Dehradun district for the different income generation activity. Doon Farmer Producer organization registered under company act and working in Doiwala block of Dehradun district.

#### Going solar- A support through Give India

Affordable solar lamps have been distributed to people in Bihar mainly to replace kerosene lantern and lamps. The low cost solar lanterns have received great response in rural area in Bihar where power cut is too frequent.

Also in Bihar Solar lamps are being distributed free of cost to needy villagers where power supply is erratic and insufficient.

Solar cookers have been given to the community mainly as a demonstrative unit. People are amazed to experience how quick the solar energy cooks food without any consumable fuel and that too in hygienic way.

#### Financial Awareness Campaign- A road to financial inclusion

During last 7 years we have conducted over 500 financial literacy workshops in Bihar and all districts of Uttarakhand. 15 financial awareness workshops were arranged in different parts of Dehradun district during 2016-17.

Objective was to make people aware of planning their finances with an eye on meeting long term requirement of family. Everybody is aware of earnings, savings, expenditure and borrowings but all they need to set up their priorities and decide which expenditure is of consumptive nature and can be avoided till funds position improve and which is of utmost necessity to carry on their business, social, educational and other family requirements. A distinction has to be made between productive and consumption need and by pruning our wish list we can save a lot over a period of time. Lack of planning and not sufficient earning come in their way of savings and wealth creation. All they require is analyzing their needs, make a distinction between the need and desire, avoid wasteful expenditure and save for the future. A saving whatever small is a source of tremendous self confidence and helps in creation of wealth over a period of time. Savings apart control on wasteful expenditure, investment and assuring lives and valuables play vital role in financial planning.

# Towards a better environment-Renewal Energy: Solar lamp

During the year more than 800 solar lampshave been distributed to people in 3 districts of Bihar mainly to replace kerosene lantern and lamps. The low cost solar lanterns have received a great response in rural areas where power cuts are very frequent Supply of electricity to the towns and villagers is erratic and available



for few hours in our working area of Patna. Donations RECEIVED THROUGH GIVEINDIA ARE USED ONLY FOR POOR There are still many villages where electricity has not reached. And in the villages having



electric connections, power comes only for a few hours in a day and sometimes it doesn't come for days together. Poor People are forced to use oil/ Kerosene lamps. Solar power can supply them electricity at night thus reducing dependence on kerosene or oil. The lamp shall not only light their homes, but it can charge mobiles. Balajee identifying the poorest people from a village and distributed solar lanterns. Its also very helpful for

Save trees save environment- Like other places forest cover is fast depleting. Besides requirement of timber the trees are felled indiscriminately for firewood, fodder and other forest produce. To reduce dependence of people living on periphery of forests wed introduced fuel efficient wood stove which shall consume less wood and produce more heat. Wood stove manufactured by Philips has been introduced in our area of operations, which not only consumes less fuel but emits less smoke and produce more heat. Kerosene lantern or a lamp which burns edible oil remains only option in such circumstances. kerosene too is not easily available. It becomes even more dificult for the students. Balajee supplied a solar lamp to the family, which carries on for 5-6 hours on one charge. BSS team teaches the beneficiaries how to use this solar lamp and what the benefits are. How It has helps the children to study when electricity is not available and how the kerosene lamp is very dangerous for the eyes, as well as being the cause of fire accidents. Before the solar lamp, the family cooked their food in early evenings and had to retire for bed early too.

Simartari Village of Lakhisarai district of Bihar where electricity facility completely not available till today. Village surrounded by forests and Naxali (Local Terrorist) belt. Our team was surprised at the time of visit to know that no any person have mobile facility due to lack of electricity. Financial conditions is also very bad of all villagers. Balajee Sewa Sansthan started to work here by the help of Give India and the kind donation of donner and our team specially thanks to Giveindia Foundation.

## Skill Development Training Programs

Balajee running three multi purpose Training centre in Dehradun district and one in Barh (Patna) for Beautician Course, one year and six months Diploma courses on fashion designing among the minority community as well as some centres for all community where more than 120 girls availing the training facility.

Credit itself may not be a sufficient tool for poverty eradication in rural areas. They need a variety of services in which training on skill



development is the most relevant. A lot of the young population are migrating towards cities inthe search of jobs leaving their villages & natural Resources. Starting small enterprises at village level will provide them an additional source of Income. To train unemployed men & women in our area of operation, Give India Foundation supported by collecting donation from individual as well as corporate donor on their platform for fashion designing course of poor beneficiaries and for computer training courses.

Once the training of beneficiaries are over, Balajee Sewa Sansthan will arrange the credit to start the enterprise either by loan from Balajee or from any nationalized or rural bank. We will further help the people in providing backward as well as forward linkage for goods & services manufactured.

#### **COMPUTER TRAINING PROGRAMMES:-**

In small towns and villages, students get education in different fields getting degree or diploma. Good academic record apart, employers these days require that all their workforce should be computer literate, if not having good knowledge of it. For the children of our beneficiaries BSS established a wing By Computer training centre for providing free computer training of unemployed youths.

The target area is one of the backward sub-divisions of Patna district of Bihar where the basic condition of children, youth, women and aged are deprived. Youth form 60% of the targeted slums & villages who are in need of some basic skill to become productive and creative. Balajee is already running a computer & vocational training centre in Barh where people from poor background are provided free training. We intend to establish more qualitative computer training for needy student. Students from BPL, minority and low-income group get free education in basics and advanced computer skills at the centre. Balajee provide 4 months computer courses in Barh Centre of Patna District. In the last five years, more than 980 students have availed this facility and got jobs in factories and other institutions.




